(*Bitis arietans arietans*)



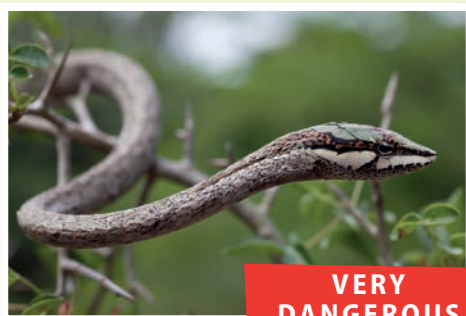

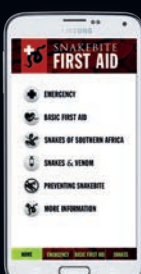
