




Medically Important

Violin Spider

(Family Sicariidae)



Maximum size 30 - 40 mm



These are free living spiders that don't build webs. They are common in caves and under rocks, logs and dark areas. They occur in houses and garages but are generally very shy of humans and scuttle off as soon as they are disturbed. They are similar in appearance to Daddy-Long-legs although the legs are not as long or thin. They are often confused with the Brown Recluse of Australia, a spider that also has a violin shape on the body. The South Africa Violin spiders are brown or grey and have spots or markings on the abdomen. This species possesses a cytotoxic venom and bites can result in tissue damage and should be treated as an open wound. Best to seek medical attention.
