MOST DANGEROUS

The **BLACK MAMBA** is considered the most dangerous due to its size and potent neurotoxic venom.



SERIOUS SNAKEBITES

Most serious snakebites are inflicted by the Mozambique Spitting Cobra, Puff Adder, Stiletto Snake and Night Adder. They account for 90% of all bites.

MOST BITES OCCUR...

- EARLY EVENING in warm summer months Jan-Apr.
- WHERE? 84% of bites are below the knee.
- WHO? Largely males between 14-25 years of age.

WHEN BITTEN

of snakebite victims need and receive antivenom.

DO NOT

... cut and suck

... apply a tourniquet

... inject antivenom
