COMMON SNAKES OF BOTSWANA



Botswana has 62 species of snakes. Eight species are considered potentially deadly. Another ten species can give a bad bite.

Twenty species are mildly venomous and not dangerous to humans. Twenty-four species are harmless.

Painful bite, but does not require antivenom

Not thought to be harmful
