Thornybush Nature Reserve has around sixty-eight different types of snakes. Six species are highly venomous, while six others can inflict a rather painful bites. Twenty species are considered mildly venomous. Thirty-six species are harmless.

HIGHLY

Has caused human fatalities

VENOMOUS

Painful bite, but does not require antivenom

MILDLY /ENOMOUS

Not thought to be harmful

HARMLESS

Not dangerous to humans
