DANGEROUS SNAKES OF BOTSWANA




Botswana has 62 species of snakes. Eight species are considered potentially deadly. Another ten species can give a bad bite. Twenty species are mildly venomous and not dangerous to humans. Twenty-four species are harmless.

DO NOT —

... apply a tourniquet.

- ... cut and suck the wound.
- ... use ice or very hot water.
- ... give the victim alcohol.
- ... apply electric shock.
- ... inject antivenom randomly. Antivenom (if required) must be administered by a doctor in a hospital environment.
