The South Coast has under forty different types of snakes. Seven species are highly venomous, while two others can inflict a rather painful bites. Three species are venomous. Seven species are considered mildly venomous. Twenty species are harmless.

Has caused human fatalities **VENOMOUS** 



Not dangerous to humans














(Dendroaspis angusticeps)







**Short-snouted Grass Snake** (Psammophis brevirostris)
















**Common Wolf Snake** (Lycophidion capense)
