DANGEROUS SNAKES of MOZAMBIQUE



Mozambique has seventy-eight species of snakes. Thirteen species are considered potentially deadly. Another seven species can inflict a bad bite. Thirty-five species are harmless.







SNAKEBITE

1 Keep the victim calm, immobilized and transport the victim to the closest hospital without delay.

IN THE EVENT OF A SNAKE BITE

2 If the victim stops breathing, resort to artificial respiration or make use of a Bag Valve Mask.

... apply a tourniquet.

EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

... cut and suck the wound.

... use ice or very hot water.

... give the victim alcohol.

... apply electric shock.

... inject antivenom randomly. Antivenom (if required) must be administered by a doctor in a hospital environment.
