# DANGEROUS SNAKES OF THE LOWVELD




The Lowveld has seventy-five different types of snakes. Thirty-six species are not venomous, while twenty-one snake species are milldly venomous. Eleven can inflict a painful bite and seven species are considered highly venomous.




(Dendroaspis polylepis)




(Naja annulifera)



HIGHLY **VENOMOUS Mozambique Spitting Cobra** (Naja mossambica)






## **EMERGENCY PROTOCOL**

#### IN THE EVENT OF A SNAKE BITE

1 Keep the victim calm, immobilized and transport the victim to the closest hospital without delay.

2 If the victim stops breathing, resort to artificial respiration or make use of a Bag Valve Mask.

3 Call the Poison Information Centre helpline for further advice: +27 861 555 777.

### DO NOT —

... apply a tourniquet.

- ... cut and suck the wound.
- ... use ice or very hot water.
- ... give the victim alcohol.
- ... apply electric shock.
- ... inject antivenom randomly. Antivenom (if required) must be administered by a doctor in a hospital environment.
