COMMON SNAKES OF SKUKUZA



Skukuza has approximately 32 species of snakes. Six species are considered highly venomous while four are considered venomous. One species can inflict a painful bite that may require stitches. Ten species are mildly venomous and eleven are harmless to humans.

Not dangerous to humans






