DANGEROUS SNAKES of MOZAMBIQUE



Mozambique has around 80 species of snakes. Thirteen species are considered potentially deadly. Another seven species can inflict a bad bite. Two can deliver a painful bite that may require stitches. Twenty three species are mildly venomous and thirty-five species are harmless.

EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

IN THE EVENT OF A SNAKE BITE

1 Keep the victim calm, immobilized

DO NOT

... apply a tourniquet.

... cut and suck the wound.

... use ice or very hot water.

... give the victim alcohol.

... apply electric shock.

... inject antivenom randomly. Antivenom (if required) must be administered by a doctor in a hospital environment.
