COMMON SNAKES OF GHANZI



Ghanzi has around 23 species of snakes. Seven species are considered highly venomous. Another four species can give a bad bite. The majority of snakes in the area are mildly venomous or harmless to humans.

Not dangerous to humans








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EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

IN THE EVENT OF A SNAKE BITE

1 Keep the victim calm, immobilized and transport the victim to the closest hospital without delay.

2 If the victim stops breathing, resort to artificial respiration or make use of a Bag Valve Mask.

DO NOT -

- ... apply a tourniquet.
- ... cut and suck the wound.
- ... use ice or very hot water.
- ... give the victim alcohol.
- ... apply electric shock.
- ... inject antivenom randomly. Antivenom (if required) must be administered by a doctor in a hospital environment.
